In this section we explore the strengths and weaknesses of collaborations and partnerships and to understand the issues involved in their operation.

16:15 – 16:45 **Activity 4: How should we evaluate regional collaborations and partnerships?**

We conclude this section by considering how we should evaluate regional collaborations and partnerships.
